Following the committal service at the cemetery, lunch will be served in the church basement. Everyone is invited.

If you are driving in the procession to the cemetery, state law requires that you: Turn on your headlights and tail lights; Follow the vehicle in front of you as closely as is safe considering the weather, etc. (We suggest about one car length in town, two or three lengths on the highway, if the weather is dry); Subject to maintaining the close interval, don't drive faster than 5 miles under the posted limit; Stay right behind the car in front of you, even through stop signs or red lights (watch for other cars, pedestrians, etc. and exercise reasonable care); Yield to police, fire or emergency medical vehicles with sirens or flashers at any time. This will override any preceding rules.
